

◆ Wednesday, September 6—We will mark the return of two vital programs at St. Paul on Wednesday, September 6. First up is the return of SPLASH. Our after-school program, which takes place each Wednesday from September through April, will welcome 50+ students from the school district. During their time at SPLASH, students will have snacks, music, arts & crafts, STEM, Bible

story and recreation—creating opportunities for them to connect with the volunteers, each other and God. Registration is currently open to this program, although there are limited spaces available. Check the *Midweek* email for a link to sign up or send an email to check for availability.

Following our first SPLASH of the school year, we'll have our first Messy Church! Beginning at 5:30 p.m., we'll be having a Messy Carnival as we learn about Joseph after enjoying a delicious fair-themed meal. You won't want to miss this program that will have all the fun of a carnival but none of the long lines or heat!

- Saturday, September 14—On top of the return of SPLASH and Messy Church, September will also bring the return of St. Paul All Ages Bingo! Make plans to join us on Saturday, September 14 for a fun evening beginning at 6:00 p.m. (Doors open at 5:45 p.m.) in Fellowship Hall. As always, all are welcome for an evening of fun. Light snacks will be provided but you're welcome to bring your own or some to share!
- Sunday, September 15—All families are invited to participate in a family mission workshop (that includes brunch!). During the workshop, which will begin after worship (around 10:30 a.m.), we'll review what a family mission statement is and have time to create one (or revise an already created one). If time allows, we'll create visual representations of the mission statements to display in family homes.
- Sunday, September 22—LIFT (Living in Faith Together) will return on Sunday, September 22. Welcome Neighbor STL Supper Club



St. Paul is again hosting the Welcome Neighbor STL Supper Club on **Saturday, October 5, 2024 at 6:00 p.m.** The Supper Club supports refugee families recently settled in St. Louis. Your meal will be prepared by our new refugee neighbors, who will share their

cooking skills by providing a table of traditional food from their countries of origin. Guests have an opportunity to hear their story and learn about their culture. These meals present an opportunity for people who have been defined for too long as victims to share knowledge and skills unique to them. It is an opportunity for recipients to become partners in fundraising efforts to support the cooks in their catering business and to set the refugee cooks on a path of greater independence and confidence in their new lives here in the USA. A menu featuring foods from Morocco and Afghanistan will delight your senses. The cost is \$40/person. Welcome Neighbor STL is a multi-faceted organization with over 3,000 supporters. Welcome Neighbor currently helps 300 refugees from 11 countries. They pair volunteers with new American families, teach English, organize supper clubs, teach driving lessons, offer citizenship classes, host family outings and holiday gatherings and schedule COVID-10 vaccine appointments. The new families also make thousands of meals for unhoused persons.

Renovation Update

The Fellowship Hall restrooms remodel is now essentially complete. The administrative entry project is in full swing after a small delay to work through some HVAC issues. As you read this, the tile, painting and flooring work in the Heritage Room restroom is being done. Rough electrical work has been completed, the tray ceilings have been framed out and fireproofing material has been applied to the ceilings. It is anticipated that the Heritage Room wall will be taken out during the last week in July, and the painting and flooring are scheduled to also be done in the two front offices during this time. Painting, flooring, lighting and finishes in the rest of the entry and hallways will be done in the coming weeks.

The general contractor feels we are still on target for a completion date around the first week in September. Oh, and the main parking lot is getting patched, sealed and striped the last week of July as well.

South Conference's 60th anniversary celebration—Jubilee Joy. Offering for this mission will be shared at the ISC Annual


Meeting on October 19 at Evangelical UCC in Highland. One hundred percent of this offering will be retained in our
